



## Mr Monojir Ali

**B**orn in Bangladesh, in 1945, Mr. Monojir Ali is the youngest of three sons of Mr. Mosoddar Ali Sarang. His family is eminent in the area of Sarangbari, where they helped local villagers by providing them with a local school, mosque, post office, and Moktab, resulting in jobs being provided for many. In December, 1965 after he had finished his secondary education, Mr. Ali arrived to England. After working hard previously in other jobs he entered the catering business in 1983, which he sustained till 2000, during which he was also occupied with property business. Soon after in 2001, he created his own property managing and developing business named Ammar Property Service and ever since, has been flourishing in this line of business.

At the time of the freedom movement in Bangladesh, which took place in 1971, Monojir Ali was in Bangladesh. He contributed by taking on the role to take many youngsters to Karimgunj, in India, where they were trained to fight for freedom. He provided many of the freedom fighters with food and accommodation.

Mr. Ali has always been concerned with charity work and realized the importance of helping the community since a young age, due to the inspirations of his family. He has provided funds for Beanibazar College and Beanibazar women's College, as well as donating to Mullapur Union High School, and many other schools, colleges,



madrasa's, clubs and sports organizations. In particular, he provided a local Madrasah with a generator, and funded them to build another room. He helped Beanibazar High School financially, by paying for the cost of two storey buildings to be built, one of which has productively been constructed. In 2005, he founded the Nidonpur Suppatala Girl's High School. He is the Founder of the Name and Advisor of 'Beanibazar Pouro Unnoyon Songstha UK'.

Working alongside many community schemes as a volunteer is also something which Monojir Ali is familiar to. He has organized flood relief programs in 2004 and was the founder trustee of Beanibazar Education Trust. In addition, he was the founder and chairman of the Bengali Community Education centre in Northwest London and is the trustee of the Bangladesh Centre in London. Not only this, but he was the treasurer of Beanibazar

Jonokola Samithi and now takes on the role of vice president. Mr. Ali is the general secretary and advisor of Nidonpur Suppatala Welfare Organization. These are to mention just a few of the organizations which he partakes in.

Such work has not gone unrecognized, as in 2006; Mr. Ali was nominated for a Channel S award in recognition of his contributions to the Bengali community. He also received a guard of Honour from Controlment Army Sector 2nd and Scouts Association, the local community and the management of PHG High School Beanibazar during the opening ceremony of a new building he had funded.

During his spare time, Mr. Ali enjoys traveling and realizes the importance of maintaining a good lifestyle. He is also a big fan of sports, having been involved from all sorts of sports from cycling to badminton.
