



Mr. Alhaj Mohammed Humayun Kabir

A well known community activist Alhaj Mohammed Humayun Kabir is currently residing in Chadwell Heath. He hails from the village of Shibgonj, Sonarpara, Thana and District Sylhet, Bangladesh.

The second son of Late Md. Abdul Kadir, a Mechanical Foreman by Profession at the Power Development Board in Sylhet, Bangladesh who was also a well known community activist of his time, Alhaj Mohammed Humayun Kabir started his education from local Primary and Secondary School and completed Bachelor of Arts from well-known Modon Mohon College at Sylhet. Although a meritorious student, Alhaj Mohammed Humayun Kabir could not avail good opportunities to continue his education due to family burden and was compelled to work as Teaching Assistant at PDB Junior High School whilst studying.

Alhaj Mohammed Humayun Kabir was ambitious about his post graduation and eventually completed his MA in Islamic History at Jogonath University College, Dhaka, Bangladesh. In 1997, he came to United Kingdom to devote himself in legal profession but later he changed his mind. Alhaj Mohammed Humayun Kabir is the second among the Four brothers and five sisters and due to sudden death of his father, he had to



shoulder the family burden and took job at Power Development Board in 1986. He continued to his employment to work till 1996.

In 1998 he joined the first Bangladeshi Printing Press in UK the Languatec Printing Press as Manager. By working as Manager to Languatec Printing Ltd. and under the active co-operation of Alhaj Dr.M A Aziz the partner of Languatec Printing Ltd.

Alhaj Mohammed Humayun Kabir was elected for the fourth term as general secretary of THAMES Bengali Association and Active member of Chadwell Heath Cultural Association as well as number of other community organisations including Assistant

General Secretary of Bangladesh Cricket Forum, UK, Advisor Redbridge Bangladeshi Business Forum, UK.

In 1995 Alhaj Mohammed Humayun Kabir married to an expatriate lady from a respected Muslim Family from Sylhet Bangladesh and came to UK in 1997 to live here permanently. He is blessed with four children namely Khadhija Naimah Kabir, Zainab Maliha Kabir, Arif Shahriar Kabir, and Nafees Talha Kabir. Among them one is attending Al-Mizan Hifz Madrasa and all others are going to school.
