



Mufti Shah Sadruddin

Born in the village of Gulduba, Hobigonj in Bangladesh in the year 1957, Mr. Shah Sadruddin came to the UK in 1969, along with his mother and younger brother. After his arrival, Mr. Sadruddin attended Europe's first ever Islamic college named Darul-Uloom Bury Lancashire. Here, he passed with distinction in M.A Islamic Theology. Then in 2 years later in 1987, he moved to Egypt where he attended Al-Azhar University, Cairo, and he attained a B.A. Honours in Hadeeth. Afterwards, he traveled to India in 1990 and here he achieved a PhD in Islamic Law. After years of education and hard work, in 1999, Mr. Mufti Shah Sadruddin was given the Khalifa title by Shaykhul Hadeeth Hazrat Maulana Yusuf Motala Saheb.

Mr. Mufti Shah Sadruddin has had a vast career history. In 1988, he was the Imam for East London Masjid in Whitechapel. Then in 1989 he taught Islamic Law in Darul-Uloom London. Few years later, he went onto becoming the teacher of Hadeeth and Tafseer, in the same school. He was also the Imam and Khateeb for Forest Gate Masjid situated on Romford Road, from 1993-1997. After this Mr. Sadruddin decided to go to Bangladesh and teach there for a while, and so, from 1997 to 1999 he taught Hadeeth in Darus-Salaam, an Islamic school in Sylhet. Straight after that, Mr. Sadruddin traveled to the United States, where he was appointed



the first ever Shaykhul Hadeeth in the history of America, in Darul-Uloom AL-Madania, which was located more specifically in New York, Buffalo. Mr. Sadruddin did not stop there though; he went onto traveling to Portugal in 2000, where he was also the first Shaykhul Hadeeth in Darul-Uloom. Moreover, from 2006-2007, he taught Bukhari Shareef in Khilafat Building in Sylhet.

Participating in various community organizations and charity events is also something Mr. Sadruddin makes plenty of time for. He was one of the founders of Portsmouth Jame Masjid and one of the formatters of Isha'atul Islam Ford Square Masjid. In 1988, he was the Assistant Convenor of British Muslim Action Front. He was one of the Founding Advisors of Jamiah Islamiah Catts Hill, the Founding Chairman of Markazul

Uloom in Dalston, Darus Sunnah in Forest Gate, Mazahirul Uloom in Mile End Masjid and Jamiate Ulama Islam, the London branch.

Furthermore, in 1997, Mr. Sadruddin was the Assistant Secretary General for Jamiate Ulama Islam in Bangladesh. He was the founding member of Isha'ul Muslimeen, founding chairman of Shah Waliullah Education trust in Bangladesh, both in Bangladesh, and the Chief Patron for Jamiatush Shabaab Europe. He has also been elected as the chairman for Jamiate Ulama Islam Europe and Islamic Education Board to name a few.

Currently, Mr. Mufti Shah Sadruddin lives happily with his wife and has been blessed with 6 beautiful children, 4 of whom are sons and two daughters.
